Incident Title: Incident Response on Severity

Summary

An Apollo employee was waiting to take his drug test at an occupational clinic. While waiting to take the drug test, an employee from another contractor came in with a very severe hand injury. They were bleeding an overwhelming amount, and most likely needed surgery on their hand. The clinic was not able to treat an injury of this severity, and they were sent to an Emergency Room.

With an injury of this severity, time is of the essence, and we need to get employees treatment as soon as possible. Know your emergency response plan, before we have an incident.



What Went Right?

- The injured employee was driven by another worker, not putting himself, and other drivers at risk

What Went Wrong?

- The injured employee went to the wrong location for the severity of their injury, wasting time. They should have been sent to the emergency room immediately

Lessons Learned

- Respond to injuries based on the severity of the injury
- Have the Apollo Incident Response Maps posted at each Jobsite so we can respond quickly to injuries
- Ensure that everyone knows the incident response plans for each jobsite they work on
